

Haiti Prayer Points

- Lord, Be real as the God of all comfort and the God of compassion.
- Many countries are sending rescue workers, medical personnel, and military aid. There will be a huge need for translators of several different languages. Communication will be a cumbersome barrier to the work they are trying to accomplish.
- Haiti is not a culture of order. The leadership will struggle to contain the violence in this desperate situation. Pray for peace to permeate the area, for Christians to act like Christ.
- Water is in such short supply that it has become a commodity of trade.
- As the homeless population of Port au Prince moves to outlying communities across Haiti, those towns will experience shortage of medical, food, and energy supplies.
- Many who were not at home when the earthquake happened can not get to their residences. They are concerned about their property as looting continues to be a problem.
- Missionaries and benevolent organizations have been heavily effected, and now must make decisions as to whether they must return to the United States or if they are equipped to stay and be of service. Pray for discernment.
- Hearts of people around the world to reach out to God's Haitian children with wisdom and generosity during this time of need.
- Protection for orphans from those who would prey upon them.
- Compassionate hearts and protection for those who have been flown in to provide relief.
- Wisdom and discernment for those who are considering whether to go to Haiti at this time.
- For patience, compassion, wisdom and strength for Roger and Norma Alexander and the staff at Sonlight as they are Jesus to those in Port de Paix. May God be glorified through their ministry.
- The psychological effects of this earthquake on all the people of Haiti – those personally affected in Port au Prince and those with loved ones there.
- For physical and emotional stamina for aid workers and missionaries helping in the recovery efforts.
- Dr. Bob Johnson's medical team (Missions of Love ministries) which leaves for Haiti Jan 30, along with CCC member, Dr. Santiago Arruffet.
- Mark Stuart and others from Hands and Feet who are organizing the relief in the Jacmel area.
- Discernment on the part of the Crossroads response team and unity in their midst as they strive to be appropriate and effective.
